Families

Our provision for families has had to adapt over the past year. Despite the lockdowns and numurous restrictions we have continued to create a tendancy within families to socialise naturally in Welsh and this on a regular basis by providing a combination of digital activites, live digital activities and face to face activities. Examples of our digital activities are story sessions, craft activities and nature treasure hunts that were prepared before hand to encourage families to get outside safely. Our live digital activites were held on the Zoom platfform and included a St David's Day crafft session and a virtual Santa's Grotto. And then, once restrictions alowed, we were proud to offer a series of Buggy Walks in three areas and Story Sessions indoors.

Accross the year we held 44 activites face to face with 425 children and 380 adults enjoying our community activities for families through the medium of Welsh.

Digitaly thoughout the year, we held 111 sessions with the activities reaching 41, 939 people as we were working for far.



This year, nearly 43,000 people have taken part and attended our face-to-face and digital activities as we adapted our work.

Children and young people

This year has been an extraordinary one due to the arrival of the Pandemic. We had to adjust Menter's activities for children and young people and think of new and fresh ideas. With school children learning online it was even more important than ever before for us to offer a chance for them to socialise and use their Welsh outside the classroom.

The provision of sessions for this target group has varied to answer the demand. Our sessions and activities included Disgo Cwis, Cwis Dim Clem, Clwb Joio Drama and Youth Forum that were all held digitally on-line. An extensive depository of resources were created to share on our social media and with our schools. Many competitions were arranged that attracted a large number of entries.



112,863 children and young people joined us online to use their Welsh and to participate in Menter's activities during the last year.

Welsh communities

Offering community opportunities and running community activities has been much more challenging this year due to lockdown. However, Menter has adapted and succeeded in organising regular live digital and digital events in order to create the pattern of socialising in Welsh in a variety of fields to appeal to a wide range of people. We have run fitness sessions, healthy eating, saving money and car maintenance by releasing a series of videos. Our live digital provision has included topical evenings such as cooking, flower arranging and beauty, guest speaker evenings and quizzes. We have continued to co-ordinate the Carmarthen Journal's Welsh Page and have made contact with a number of new Welsh learners during this period. As Menter is well established in our communities, we are often the first point of contact for many general enquiries and Welsh language enquiries. In response, we have been able to offer one-to-one virtual support to individuals to develop digital skills that have been essential during lockdown.

Through our community work this year we have organised 270 online events and over 203,000 have joined and participated in our activities and used their Welsh.

Helo Blod

At the start of the year, the project underwent some changes, the Welsh for Business project was rebranded and changed to 'Helo Blod'. The Helo Blod project offers free support and assistance to businesses on their use of the Welsh language. This can include free translation, bilingual marketing, help with recruitment and any other support regarding their use of the Welsh language. This is a national project, with the 'Helo Blod Local' officers working from the Mentrau laith offices across Wales.

The work in this area is split between Menter Gorllewin Sir Gar and Menter laith Sir Benfro. During the 2020/2021 period, we continued to support businesses virtually. During the year we successfully contacted 81 businesses in Carmarthenshire, and referring them to the Helo Blod hotline where they can access translation work. We gave further support to 7 of those businesses in order to increase their use of the Welsh language over a specific period of time. Although there are fewer virtual events being held, we managed to attend 16 online networking / business events to spread the message about the project. 3 virtual events were held to promote the project, 2 of which were regional events and one a national event.

Through our work in this field in Menter Gorllewin Sir Gâr's area, 81 businesses have heard about the project and the opportunity to increase their use of the Welsh language, and 7 businesses in the area have received further intensive support with their use of the Welsh language, whether through bilingual signs, menus, sections of websites etc.

Digital inclusion

The delivery of contracts on behalf of the job centres to work with the unemployed, is now being provided under the MGSG Digidol brand, which is defined as a division of Menter Gorllewin Sir Gâr. 2020-21 has been very different in terms of implementing the contracts to work with the unemployed, as a result of COVID 19 MGSG Digidol's work ceased for a time and the staff were furloughed for periods ranging from two months to five months. When the work resumed, the service to support individuals referred for help, mainly to create CVs and cover letters, was provided over the telephone with the staff working from home.

During the period under review, contracts were delivered on behalf of job centers in Ceredigion, Carmarthenshire, Pembrokeshire, Swansea, Neath Port Talbot, Bridgend and Rhondda Cynon Taf. Despite the break in provision, MGSG Digidol worked with approximately 1,300 individuals referred for support and assistance during 2020-2021 by the individual Job Centers.



Approximately 1,300 unemployed individuals referred by job centres from across seven counties, received support.


Profi Project

Since April 2020, we've focussed on adapting the programme to share advice with pupils who were learning remotely. The programme has continued to support young people by offering one to one mentoring over the phone and email. Focussing on health and well-being has been essential during these times of adjusting. A well-being leaflet was created and circulated by schools to families during Spring 2020. The leaflet was also posted on social media reaching 5,196 on Facebook 865 on Twitter and was retweeted and shared by the Welsh Language mental health support organisation www.meddwl.org



We've secured further funding through the Welsh Government Rural Communities - Rural Development Programme 2014 - 2020, which is funded by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development and the Welsh Government. This funding enables us to appoint a further Project Officer for two years from 2020 - 2022 to support with researching elements for the content of the website and develop ideas for the creation of an interactive skills guiz to help young people develop skills for the world of work. This is an additional income stream of £120,015.00 towards the programme. A project officer was appointed in October 2020. Securing this funding adds value to the Profi programme by focussing on the development of an interactive guiz that will form part of the website. Five short films will be

We've shared the adapted the content of our presentations, videos and resources on creating a CV and preparing for interviews with 7 schools. In addition to sharing with schools via email and Teams, we've posted the videos on the Menter Gorllewin Sir Gâr social media platforms. To date, the 24 video clips have been viewed 7,517 on Facebook, 2,295 on Instagram, and 422 on YouTube.



The wellbeing leaflet reached 5,196 individuals on Facebook and 865 on Twitter, 24 animated video clips were scripted, created and shared containing advice on skills for the world of work. The videos were viewed 7,517 on Facebook, 2,295 on Instagram, and 422 on YouTube reaching 37,262. In addition to the videos resources and kahoot quizzes have been created to encourage pupils to participate in a fun and engaging way. In order to encourage young people to co-design the Profi Website 9 Focus Groups have been arranged to gather feedback and ideas for content and style of the skills quiz. A total of 32 meetings have been held with partners and organisations to encourage a collaborative approach to the development of the programme.

The Profi Team attended 24 learning and training sessions to develop their skills.

Mentrau laith Cymru

Menter Gorllewin Sir Gâr is part of the Mentrau laith Cymru network. There are 22 Welsh Language Initiatives active in Wales. Nationally, the Mentrau employ over 300, as well as part-time and other occasional opportunities. The Mentrau work with around 1,000 volunteers and hold thousands of activities each year with over.



Priority areas

The Priority Areas project worked in wards including Llanfihangel-ar-Arth Ward, Carmarthen Wards and Cenarth Ward. The linguistic challenges of the three areas vary and the officer's aim was to provide planning sessions with language partners, community organizations and the local community. The input created operational plans to develop the use of Welsh in the areas and to develop activity and opportunities to use the Welsh language in the wards. The project included a Leadership Academy Scheme, which gave the young people of the priority areas the opportunity to gain confidence, become active in their area, and increase the area's Welsh language activity. Congratulations to the crew for achieving the project and to run both face-to-face and virtual events. The main achievements of the project included the input of local residents and a partners for the planning work in order to have a regular meetings about new activities, avoid duplication of work and negotiate forward planning and co-marketing in the county. The project led to the opportunity to organize events on a different scale including Gŵyl Canol Dre festival which has given Menter Gorllewin Sir Gâr a prominent platform, as well as a platform for the Welsh language in Carmarthen and across the county which has led to a growth in the number of followers on Menter's social media platforms.

Gŵyl Canol Dre

Gŵyl Canol Dre Festival is one of Menter's main events. The festival was held in 2018 and 2019 at Parc Myrddin Park, Carmarthen. The Gŵyl Canol Dre 2020 and 2021 have been postponed due to Covid restrictions but with the situation changing regularly, we hope to return in 2022.
